Professor Joe Luca

Dean, Graduate Research School, Edith Cowan University

Professor Joe Luca is a former Dean of Graduate Research School, Edith Cowan University (ECU), Perth in Australia. He specializes in educational management and building academic collaborations.

His qualifications include PhD, Master, Diploma and Bachelor degrees in mathematics, computing, education and computer education. He has also published over 70 papers, book chapters and journal articles related to researching applications of computer technologies in teaching and learning.

He has been researching teaching practice for many years, working collaboratively with a group of researchers at ECU exploring effective implementations of online learning, and has published extensively in this field. He has won a number of prizes for teaching, including the Vice-Chancellors award for excellence in teaching.

His researches have been cited worldwide. They are focused on developing quality doctoral programs encompassing supervisory practice and training programs, industry engagement, developing impact, online delivery, admission and administration processes and international collaborations.

Professor Dr. Kriengsak Chareonwongsak

Professor Dr. Kriengsak Chareonwongsak graduated with first class honours and obtained a PhD in Economics in 1981 at Monash University, Australia. He obtained a Master of Public Administration from Harvard University, USA, Master Degree from Judge Business School, Cambridge University, having also a D Phil (Doctor of Philosophy in Management) and Post Doctoral Studies (Public Policy and Management) at the University of Oxford, UK. He graduated from the National Defence College of Thailand and also graduated from the esteemed King Prachatipok Institute.

Besides teaching at Monash University, he was involved in economics research at the Impact Research Centre, University of Melbourne and at Telecom Australia. He also held a position at the Graduate School of Economics and Business Administration, Kasetsart University, Thailand.

Presently, Prof. Dr. Kriengsak is Chairman of the Nation-Building Institute (NBI), Senior Fellow, Harvard University, Professor of Management and Economics, Othman Yeop Abdullah Graduate School of Business, Universiti Utara Malaysia (UUM), Malaysia and the Academic Dean, University of London, Thailand Centre, EMFSS Programs Led by London School of Economics and Political Science (LSE). He was an elected member of the Board of Directors of the Harvard Kennedy School Alumni Association. He has been also a Research Professor at Regent University, USA and an Adjunct Professor at many universities both in Thailand and overseas.

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
